Producer/Director/Cinematographer: "breathe in...breathe out...", TRT 5:15 S16mm film (2013)

This dance for the camera considers her final moments as a woman recalls events from her life. The film was selected for screening at the International Dance for Screen Festival (2014)

Producer/Director/Cinematographer: "Sunday Lunch", 16mm film, TRT 6:00 (2006) This short film is a completed segment of a longer work in progress, "Songs from Far Away", based on Rainer Maria Rilke's series of poems, "The Voices". "Sunday Lunch", based on "The Song of the Orphan Girl" explores the sense of loneliness and abandonment experienced by an orphan.

This short film explores alienation and anxiety through recorded automatic telephone answering systems. Received an Honorable Mention in 2004 Black Maria Film Festival and was screened at the 2004 Maryland Film Festival.

Producer/Director/Writer/Composer: "Locust Point", TRT 26:46 16mm film, (1997) Completely funded by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) through the Independent Television Service (ITVS), this film explores experiences of immigrants coming to America in the early 1900's. The film employs stylized re-constructions along with original first person audio accounts (re-corded), archival images, and an original soundtrack. "Locust Point" was selected for the national television series, "American Independents".

Producer/Director/Composer: "Nicodemus", TRT 56:46, 3/4SP, (1992) Funded by the Kansas Committee for the Humanities, the Maryland State Arts Council, and the Maryland Film Commission, "Nicodemus" explores this little known town in northwestern Kansas. The only surviving African-American town from post-Civil War America, Nicodemus continues today with fewer than seventy-five residents. Selected for screenings in the Athens International Film Festival, "Nicodemus" has received regional PBS screenings.

Producer/Director/Composer: "Shelter: Conversations with Homeless Men", TRT 58:00, 3/4SP, (1989)

This documentary was shot entirely on location in Kansas City, Missouri and Greensboro, North Carolina. The tape presents a highly personalized view into the lives of six homeless men. Received the 1989 Kansas Film Institute's Award for Best Non-Fiction entry and received prime-time broadcasts over PBS affiliates in Washington, D.C. and Kansas Public Television.
