


Welcome to the RYP Zine!

Refugees are often discussed in public discourse, but rarely get the chance to express themselves directly. Even well-meaning organizations trying to help risk muffling their voices by speaking on their behalf -- reshaping the narrative and presenting them chiefly through the lens ring about their harrowing experiences. TL;DR they are refugees. But each is an individual in their own right, and it is a disservice to define someone only by their trauma.

My students chose what they wanted to make for this anthology. Their passions and interests fueled this wonderful zine. They had the freedom to create art and write about any topic they wanted, in any language they wished--and they did.

With the exception of spelling, grammar, and slight digital editing, this zine is completely in their voices. This anthology is 100% theirs, and here they are:


- My real name is Tim but all my document my name is written TIEM. They add an ein it.

Rwanda is a small country but a good country.


Rwanda is hilly and has a population above 13 million people.


Bonus: The singer and business woman Rihanna Fenty was bonn on February 20th.

Notes:

- ① Often refugees do not have official documents verifying their ages and birthdays. When they are given USA papers their birthday is always January 1st + an approximation of age by the organization handling their refugee status.
- 2 many refugees have their names translated from a non-English script into the closest name possible in English. This is called "translation."

my art teacher if I could try it. I tried it, and it worked, so I can use it now too.






























OH LOVE, A BREAK UP SONG By Nura

I STILL LOVE YOU AND STILL WISH YOU A GOOD LIFE




God Is Good By Beatrice Joseph

He loves me so much his love is so strong that he created me as a beautiful woman




My Lord, since I was a little girl



Is It Time?




My name is Nura and I am a Muslim. I don't know much about

Ben (pages 14-15, appears as Dj Benny on page 25): Ben is from Tanzania. His parents are from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Ben arrived to the USA 5 years ago (2018). He speaks Swahili, Kibembe, English, and a bit of Spanish. He likes to play soccer and his favorite color is yellow.

Note: Ben is a man of many names (he introduced himself this summer as Ben, Lubungwe, and Luke). He primarily goes by Ben though. His girlfriend, Leya, chose his DJ name.

Anne Pauline (pages 5 and 10): Anne Pauline is from Senegal and came to the USA a year ago (the summer of 2022). She is 15 years old. She speaks French, a little bit of Spanish, and English. She enjoys crocheting and swimming. She wants to be a powerful business woman when she grows up.

Note: Anne Pauline is incredibly impressive and there is no doubt that she will fulfill her dream of becoming a powerful business woman.

Salome L.O.V.E (author and lead vocalist of the rap on page 19):

Salome L.O.V.E. is from Tanzania and now lives in the USA. She wants tovisit India, it is her "dream place." She speaks Swahili, English, French, andis learning Hindi. She came to the USA in 2019 when she was 10 years old. She is now 15 running on 16 (her birthday is September 9th, where is her present????) She is an up and coming actress, dancer, and rapper. Jesus comes first in her life.

Note: Salome is a very talented performer and rapper. She stole the show in her school's production of Snow White where she played Snow White's pet chicken.

Nura (page 17, background dancer on page 19, author on pages 20 and 23): Nura is from Ethiopia. He speaks Afar and English. He arrived to the USA 7 years ago (2008). He is 15 years old. He loves dancing, high speed trains, and his favorite car is a Toyota Supra.

Note: Nura is a dancing fiend. He got rave reviews from the Dance teacher after every class.

Leya (pages 4, 11, 12, and 14-15): Leya is from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. She lived in Uganda for 7 years before moving to the USA a year ago (2022). She is 16 years old. She speaks Swahili, Kibembe, and English. In Uganda, at the age of 12, she realized she liked drawing flowers.

Note: Leya mostly drew flags and flowers this summer. Her drawings improved over the summer too.

Beatrice aka Trice (page 14, 18, and background vocalist on page 19):

Now really let that sink in.

Beatrice is from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. She arrived to the USA in 2019. She speaks 3 languages, including English. She is 15 years old and is her mother's oldest child. **Note:** Something admirable about Beatrice is that she uses art as a therapeutic tool when she is feeling low. It's a very good coping skill that will serve her well in the future.

Tiem (pages 3,7, and 22-23): Tiem was born in Sudan. He speaks Nuer, English, Arabic, Iuba, and Luggbara. He arrived to the USA on November 24th, 2021. He is 17 years old. He plays soccer and wants to be a professional soccer player someday. He has 17 brothers and 10 sisters (including Nyagagre aka Garare and Nyanene aka Ney Ney). They all share the same father but different mothers. Only 5 of his siblings came with him to the USA. **Note:** Tiem has only taken ONE art class in his entire life. Let that sink in. Then look at his drawing of Baltimore on page 7. Then look at his drawing of the train on pages 22-23.

Wladimir (pages 5 and 21): Wladimir is a new arrival from Ecuador. He speaks Spanish. He wants to be an actor.

Note: Wladimir took it upon to use Google translate to write about his name and to write his comic in English. His passion and talent is visible in all of his work.

Nyagarare aka Garare (page 16): Garare speaks Nuer, Arabic, English, and is learning Spanish. She arrived to the USA in November of 2021. She is 14 years old (as of August 2023) and will be 15 in November. She is from South Sudan and lives with her parents. She wants to be a fashion designer or a professional soccer player.

Note: Garare has never taken an art class but wants to take one this upcoming school year. She is Tiem's and Nyanene's sister. It is also worth noting she dressed very fashionably throughout the summer program.

Nyanene aka Ney Ney (pages 3, 6, 12, and 13): Ney Ney is from South Sudan. She speaks Nuer and English. She arrived to the USA in November of 2021. She got lost on the bus a lot when she first came to Baltimore because she didn't know English. She wants you to know that every experience, regardless of if it is good or bad, teaches you something about life. Each day is another chance and every day brings new opportunities. She refuses to dwell on the negative since she got a second chance at life in the USA.

Note: Ney Ney is a powerhouse of strength and positivity. She can do anything she puts her mind to. She is the sister of Garare and Tiem.

Omar (page 20): Omar is from Iraq. He speaks Arabic, Turkish, Kurdish, and English. He arrived to the USA from Turkey one year ago (2022). He is 17 years old. He is a talented and good person.

Note: Omar is admirable for his strenth and openess.

Aline T (pages 4 and 12): Aline speaks Kinyarwanda and English. She is from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Rwanda. She arrived to the USA on September 29th, 2020. She is 20 years old. In her freetime she likes to watch movies, play soccer,, and watch TikTok. She has been in the USA for 3 years (as of 2023) and she likes to dance even though she doesn't know how to.

Note: Aline will tell you exactly what she wants and will help anyone who needs it. She is definitely someone you want in your corner

Aisha (pages 8 and 9; background dancer on page 19): Aisha is from Eritrea. She speaks Afar, Amharic, Tigrayit, and English. She arrived to the USA in 2019. She is 16 years old. She loves playing soccer and wants to be a nurse.

Note: Aisha is pure enthusiasm and fun.

Yvonne (interor front cover): Yvonne is 18 years old. She speaks Kinyarwanda. S he came to the USA on March 20th, 2023 (less than a year ago). She wants to be a teacher. **Note:** Yvonne made this beautiful drawing in one day. I didn't even have to edit her drawing, the original is print quality.
