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Synopsis:

A convenience store clerk insists that all sales are final when his former elementary school teacher requests a refund on a package of condoms. Will she persuade him otherwise?

Cast of Characters:

Miss Hooper, female, late 60s-70s Mel, late teens-early 20s, male convenience store clerk

Place: a convenience store, may be suggested with a counter and a display

Time: Saturday night
