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Finalists announced for the 2025 Baker Artist Awards 36 artists selected from the Baker Artist Portfolios

BALTIMORE, MD – The Greater Baltimore Cultural Alliance and the William G. Baker, Jr. Memorial Fund are pleased to announce the finalists for the 2025 Baker Artist Awards. "The work of this year's finalist pool exemplifies the myriad creativity of the artists in the Baltimore region," commented William G. Baker, Jr. Memorial Fund President Connie Imboden, who also noted that for the first time over the Baker Artist Awards' 17 years, the finalists in the visual arts category are all female. The 36 finalists exemplify excellence in three areas: mastery of craft, depth of artistic exploration, and a unique vision.

Baker Artist Award finalists were selected by an anonymous jury from over 800 portfolios on the site and equally represent the website's six artistic disciplines: visual, literary, interdisciplinary, film/ video, performance, and music. "We are excited that the 2025 finalists include newcomers to the site, as well as those who have participated in the past." noted Jeannie Howe, Executive Director of the Greater Baltimore Cultural Alliance. "The Portfolios and the finalists continue to reflect the dynamic and historic nature of Baltimore's creative character."

The Baker Artist Awards program annually distributes \$90,000 in prize money. The total amount since 2009 has now reached more than \$1.4 million to over 156 artists. The 2025 Baker Artist Awardees will be announced in May, with one artist from each of the six artistic disciplines receiving a \$10,000 Mary Sawyers Baker Prize. One of the six selected artists will also receive the additional \$30,000 Mary Sawyers Imboden Prize, for a total prize of \$40,000—the largest art prize in the region.

Audiences can experience the work of many of these incredible artists through the 2025 Baker Artist Finalist Showcases, planned throughout April and May. This free series includes public performances, events, screenings, and exhibitions. Participation in these events is entirely optional for the finalists and has no impact on the outcome of the awards.
