Lysistrata Project 2009 (Current)

Run of the Mill Theater in collaboration with Run of the Mill Theater in collaboration with Adelante Familia will present the classic comedy Lysistrata by Aristophanes at St John's Methodist Church in Baltimore's Charles Village.

Adelante Familia, is a bilingual program that provides domestic violence victim support and counseling, crisis intervention, and abuser intervention to Spanish-speaking immigrant families in Baltimore, Maryland. Members from Adelante Familia, after repeated inquiries from their members, approached Run of the Mill Theater (RotM) about creating programming that would provide an outlet for the A.F Community. The play Lysistrata by Aristophanes is the perfect project because it places power in the hands of individuals who are generally perceived as having no power. RotM will also host Workshops open to the public that not only explore the basics in classical theater, but allow for discussion on topics surrounding domestic violence. We'll use theater as a vehicle for self-discovery and investigate different avenues that lead to empowerment.

Heroes in our Midst (Co-Producer) Baltimore, MD

Art on Purpose, an organization dedicated to using art to bring people together around issues and ideas, presents a series of exhibitions and events in partnership with the Walters Art Museum to explore, uncover and celebrate the lives of contemporary Baltimore heroes. Run of the Mill will contribute a performance about the "heroes" from four inner city schools, presented by adults and youth from the Guilford School community

Through workshops and after school programming that parallels the student's curriculum, Teen Variations engages students in order to foster an experiential approach to learning.

Run of the Mill Theater develop and produce several one-act plays titled DECODING SILENCE, based on audience contributions and interviews, about the effects of silence.
