WORDS FROM A COLLABORATOR & REFERENCE -

"Phylicia has a clear, abiding, and powerful vision as an artist. Phylicia is a work horse. I have learned there is no such thing as a half-measure for Phylicia: if she elects to take something on, she is all in. The word "authenticity" comes to mind; what Phylicia offers is derived from real substance, and this in a social media age when we see far too often eye-catching imagery or new age ideas unbacked by depth of commensurate commitment and work. Phylicia is the real deal.

Phylicia is a responsible professional. If she says she's going to do something, she does it; if she has a question or need for clarification on a collaborative project, she asks and communicates; if she runs into a snag, she troubleshoots - Phylicia is a self-starting problem solver. And perhaps what most impresses me in regard to Phylicia's professionalism is it pervades every aspect of her identity as an artist: in her commitment to her art (as stated above), and also in her documentation of her work, in how she personally presents, and in how she prepares for any occasion (from offering a few brief remarks to an all-out performance, she's ready for it). She is a partner anyone can count on as a collaborating partner."
