Philosophy of Education

I see teaching as a performing art where facilitating collective action is the aim. When I worked in Baltimore City Schools, I pushed to increase student voice in all aspects of the classroom including shaping individual projects and the entire 8th grade Science curriculum. I am now pushing myself to facilitate critical conversations in spaces primarily outside of academia and to help adults develop consensus building skills in creative projects.

Move Move Collaborative

For the last three years, I have organized and facilitated an annual ten day movement intensive. Participants come from across North America and Europe to dance with movement artists from Baltimore. We eat together, train together and create a performance together. All decisions about the performance are made by consensus. It is hard and beautiful. In 2019, we raised \$2,500 to put on an incredible event attended by almost 70 people. Performers came from Montreal, CA, Washington D.C., Murcia, Spain, New York, NY, Pittsburgh, PA , Manchester, UK, and Baltimore, MD to take part.
