## **COURSES DESIGNED-UNIVERSITY LEVEL (selected classes)**

<u>Prison Abolition: Performing Truth</u> Part of a series of nine "coordinated courses" being offered by faculty representing diverse disciplines, including Anthropology, Communication Studies, Criminal Justice, Education, Political Science, Sociology, Theatre, and Women's & Gender Studies. The course reflects on the current incarceration system in the United States. Reflections will be guided by the themes of *Oppression/Repression* and *Reactions and Resistance*. Students will use these themes to develop their own language and work around Prison Abolition.

<u>Ensemble</u> An exploration of the ensemble process used to create original performance through the tools of small live stream webcams, outdoor social distanced human installation, and digital performance. Via multidisciplinary workshop exercises, performative elements will be made, critiqued, and exchanged under a chosen theme/topic of exploration.

<u>Community Outreach</u> An experimental study of the value of arts in local community. University students will develop skills needed to work in a Baltimore City school with 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in a program that uses storytelling, performance, and other visual art activities to encourage and enhance the importance of reading and community, Arts as a Social Practice.

<u>Theatre for Social Change</u> Examination of the theory and practice of theatre and performance as a catalyst for social change through the lens of social media. Development of original works and ideas to address significant issues in the contemporary American experience.

<u>Working with Design in Performance: Making Metaphors and Conjuring Spaces</u> Self-generative MFA program

<u>Project in Process</u> Summer of the second year MFA, students continue the exploration started during the previous year. Developing proposals by conducting necessary research and sharing feedback with their peers. Proposals are presented to the Program Director and the MFA committee members in September for review
