## Kini Collins

Upon graduating from high school in 1970 I moved to New York City where, driven by the need to protect myself from armed robberies, I began a study of martial arts that was to be the focus of my life for 20 years. I studied in the US and Japan and received ranking in several different movement forms;; a third degree black belt in aikido, first degree black belt in iaido, second degree black belt in jujitsu and I was the first non-Japanese to receive a master's level ranking in Tenshin Bukkyo Ryu Heiho. I taught classes in Tokyo, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Tulsa and Baltimore.

Other than a wealth of personal combat skills and some injuries, the most useful things I took away from those years of study was an understanding that failure is a misnomer and that discipline and desire are as important as talent. After being injured and unable to practice martial arts, I began working as a free-lance writer and editor in 1994. With the thought that learning to draw would improve my observation skills and help me be a better writer, I decided to study drawing. Over the course of two years I slowly stopped writing and art-making became the focus of my life until in 2015 a discarded manuscript resurfaced and I began writing again. In 2018 I was taken on by a literary agent and in 2022 my novel, *The Singing Bowl*, was published by Spuyten Duyvil Press.
