The Failures. 2016/2017. Actor, director, co-writer with Peter Mills Weiss. Billed as "an in-depth look at what makes failures fail and how YOU can achieve success through their ineptitude and misery", The Failures is a campy horror/musical/comedy that irreverently comments on insidious everyday structures where the success of an individual relies on the failure or oppression of another. In the play, an audience member (played by Jon Swift) is tortured any time the performers do anything well. Eventually, he's tortured anyway.

The Fête of Mistakes. 2012/2014/2016. In The Fête of Mistakes, Psychic Readings Co constructs an abstract fairground littered with the overwhelmingness of despair and the sustained tension of hopefulness. Produced three different times; Ontological Hysteric Theatre (2012), Silent Barn (2014) and Le Mondo (2016)

Miss Chthonic Star Dream Pageant. 2015. Performed at Silent Barn in NY. It's a beauty pageant fashion show, a monstrous parade of internal realities fueled by sacrifice which thrusts labor, exploitation, and sexual/economic oppression onto the catwalk. Braiding pleasure and the abject and spiking it with a heavy dose of buffoonery, the dream pageant will entertain, amaze, and delightfully frustrate you!

The 50 Greatest Ladies and Gentlemen. 2009. Premiered at Ontological-Hysteric Theatre July 19 - August 1. In this installment of Performance Thanatology's ongoing research in death and performance, a solitary figure performs all his old songs and dances despite the loss of his partner, the loss of his dancing shoes, and the loss of his teeth. Somewhere between *Krapp's Last Tape* and Artaud's *Spurt of Blood*, this is what really became of vaudeville.

<u>Do Franz West Poop.</u> 2008. Composition by Ric Royer performed at the Baltimore Museum of Art. it included several pieces of chewing gum and a list of onomatopoetic words in reference to the works of Franz West. Performed by Ric Royer, Lauren Bender and Stephanie Barber.

<u>High Zero.</u> 2008. Performed two pieces at this major east coast festival of experimental improvised music. <u>Dark Cabinet of the Strange Weird.</u> 2008. Ric Royer and G. Lucas Crane take the art of the scary story to new dimensions and extremes as they combine Royer's surreal tales of the darkly humorous macabre with Crane's intensely terrifying soundscapes. This special vinyl release comes in a box designed by Baltimore artist Erin Womack and includes scary secret inserts.

There Were One and It Was Two. 2007. Book and CD published by *Narrow House Records*. Initially a solo performance piece, the cd/book was published Narrow House Records and features a soundtrack by John Berndt. The release event will feature a performance by the Bender Twins, sound by Berndt and my original performance about twins, decoys, shadows and other variations of The Double, providing companionship throughout life and chasing you until death.
